

Summer Camp Program 2022 At MSK

MSK will continue to follow the health and safety protocols as set out in the **MSK COVID-19 Parent Handbook 2021-2022** for the duration of the Summer Camp Programs for the Toddler, Casa and Elementary Departments. **As policy and procedures are subject to change, families will be notified of updates as they become available.**

We will continue to ensure all current infection prevention and control practices are adhered to prevent the spread of COVID-19. This includes ensuring that:

- Cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces, minimally twice a day, however more frequent cleaning and disinfection may be necessary, depending on the frequency of use and extent of soilage.
- Use of disinfectants that have a Drug Identification Number (DIN) Only those approved by Health Canada's list of hard surface disinfectants and hand sanitizers with evidence for use against COVID-19 will be used.
- Promoting and performing frequent, proper hand hygiene by hand washing with soap and water.
- All families are to continue pre-screen their child for signs and symptoms of ANY illness each day prior to attending the Camp program. **Passive Screening** will continue to be provided through signage and visual head-toe checks and observation of the students by staff throughout the camp day.
- If your child is sick with any illness they are to remain home until symptom free or cleared by a doctor

The MSK Camp programs will operate on a department basis. Each department will use one classroom for their program. Each Camp Program (Toddler/Casa/Elementary) will use their own play areas for the duration of the camp program. Programs may mix in common areas, such as the hallways or during arrivals and dismissals. We will continue to follow the applicable ratios as set out by the Child Care and Early Years Act (CCEYA)

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) - Masks -

Masking is now optional for all staff and students, parents as well as visitors to MSK.

The wearing of a face mask is now optional, should you choose to have your child wear a mask please ensure they are able to put it on and off independently and care for it. Those with a mask should also have a bag of fresh masks to change during the day as well as a dirty mask bag if disposable masks are not used.

Before & After Care Program

These programs are provided on a registration basis as indicated on the child's Summer Camp Application form. Students will not be cohorted and will use one of the MSK classrooms for Camp for their Before and After Care program.
